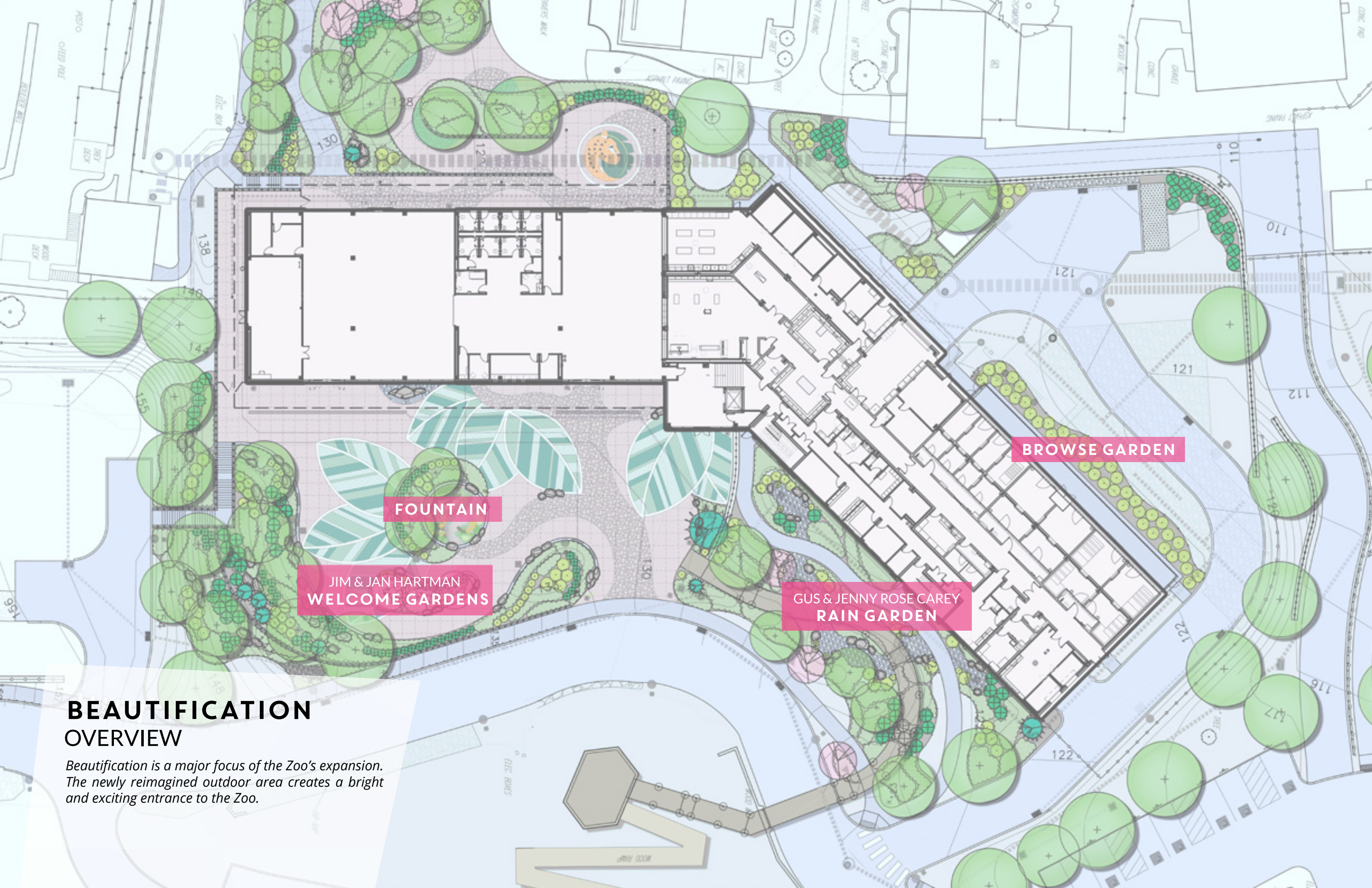

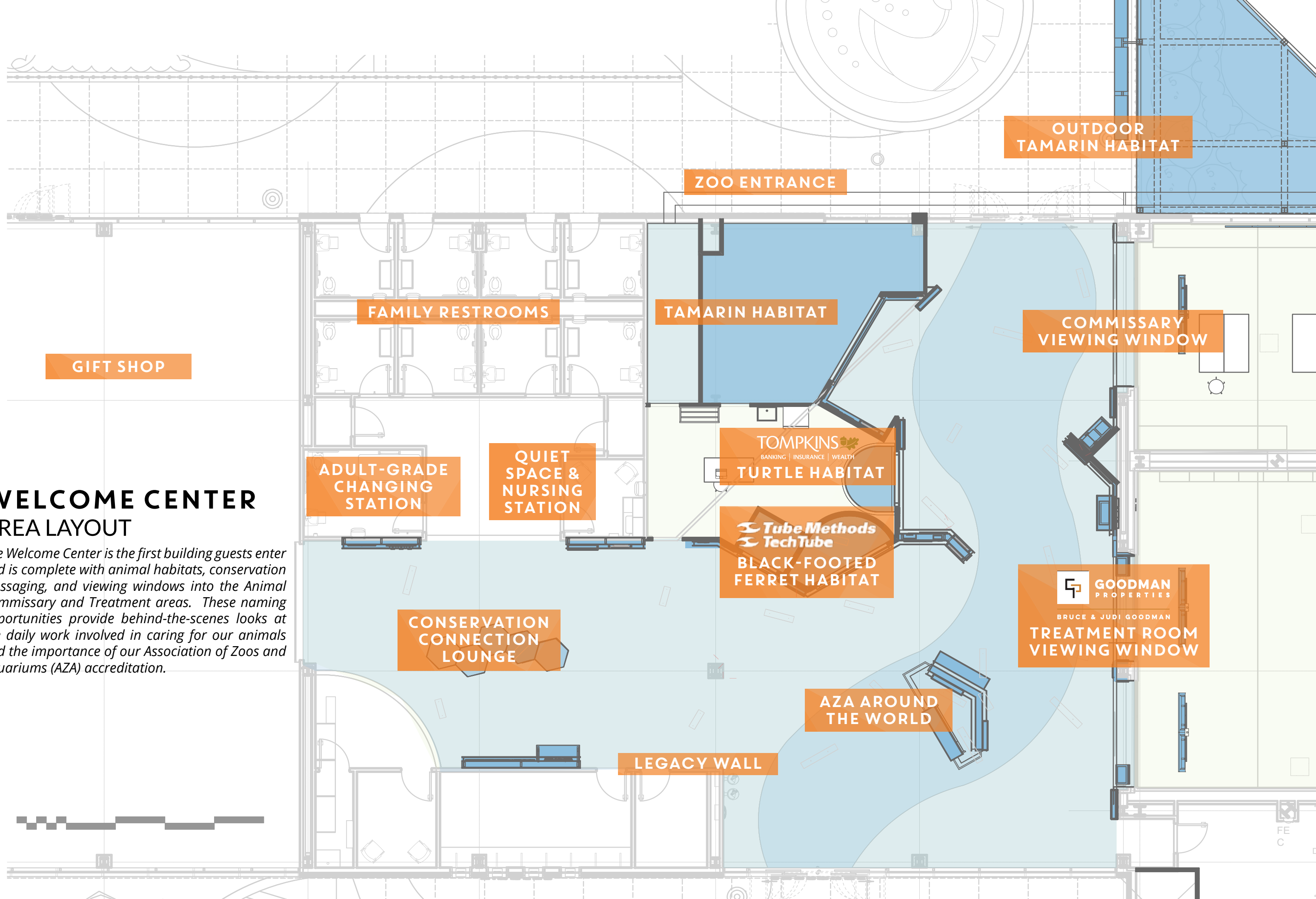

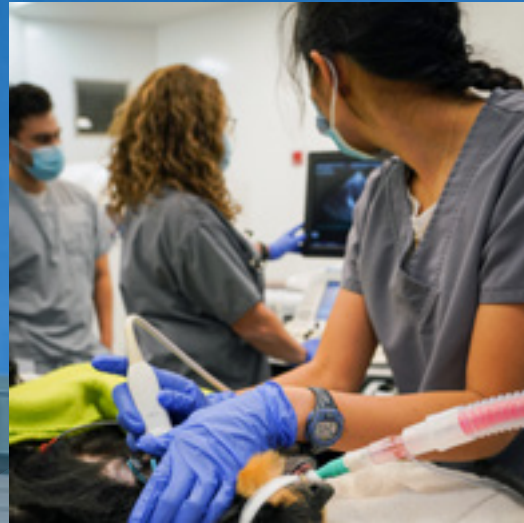
FRANK & PAIGE ENGRO VETERINARY HEALTH CENTER

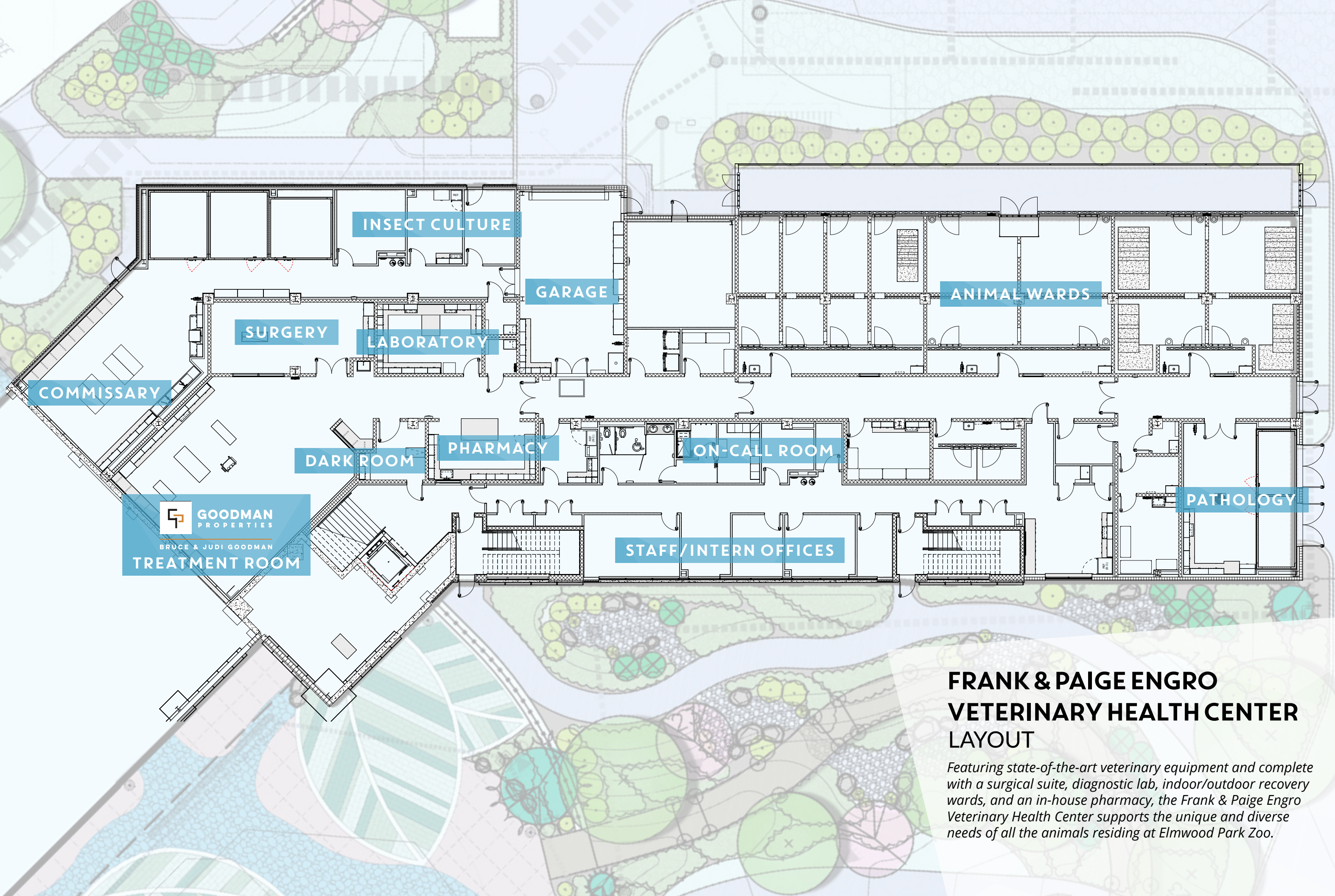
OUR VETERINARY HEALTHCARE TEAM

Elmwood Park Zoo's Animal Care department is led by Dr. Michele Goodman, VMD. Dr. Goodman is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine. She has spent the last fifteen years working with zoo, exotic and wildlife species and has been at EPZ for the last eight years. She is an instructor in the Wildlife Medicine course curriculum at Penn Vet and has authored several book chapters on various aspects of waterfowl medicine.

Associate Veterinarian Dr. Colleen Clabbers, VMD, joined the EPZ Vet Team in 2023. Also a Penn Vet graduate, Dr. Clabbers has spent over a decade working in the zoo and aquarium industry, including AZA-accredited Virginia Zoo and Busch Gardens Tampa. Certified Veterinary Technicians Kourtney Conti and Athena Chiu bring their passion for animal care and welfare to work each and every day. Kourtney joined EPZ in 2017 from Busch Gardens Tampa and Athena joined EPZ in 2023 from the Bronx Zoo. Registrar and Veterinary Assistant Holly Brown started at EPZ in 2016, coming to EPZ from the Brandywine Zoo.

The five-member Veterinary Department at the Elmwood Park Zoo is thrilled to have moved into the Frank & Paige Engro Veterinary Health Center and is now enabled to better share the work they do with the more than one million annual visitors who pass through our doors.

PHARMACY NAMING OPPORTUNITY

Medications and nutritional supplements are essential components of animal care at EPZ. The diverse animal collection requires that specialized items are routinely stocked. The Pharmacy has a small viewing window into the administration lobby and features a robust narcotics safe and a fume hood that allows for the safe handling of pharmaceutical compounds. The Pharmacy also serves as general supply storage and instrument processing and includes both Plasma and Steam Sterilization equipment.

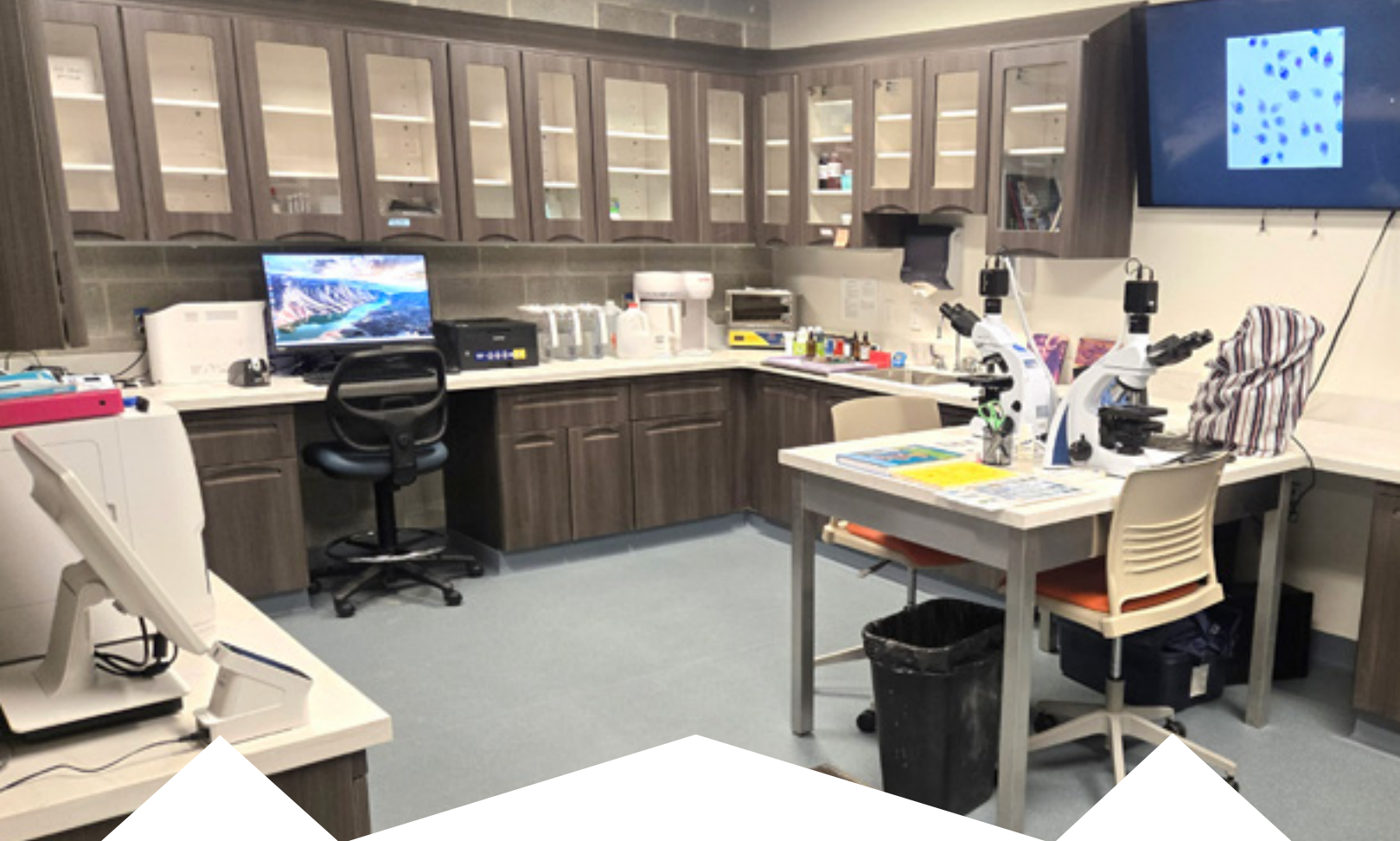
